## About the BID

he Jerome Gun Hill BID is one of seventy-six BID's throughout New York City and one of eleven BIDs in the Bronx. A bustling retail commercial district, the BID serves over 220 merchants on Jerome Avenue between E 212th St and E Mosholu Parkway N, and E Gun Hill Road between Jerome Avenue and Webster Avenue. Since its inception in January 1997, the BID has been serving small businesses that range in size from small retail shops to local and national food and retail chains and banks. Just under 1 mile from end to end, the BID is home to barber shops, salons, produce markets, restaurants, medical offices and pharmacies, shoe stores, and bodegas that together make our community so vibrant and full of life. From the



oldest mom and pop pet store in the Bronx to a cafe serving over 100 kinds of empanadas, the Jerome Gun Hill BID is sure to have what you're looking for and then some.

## Clean Up Days with FOMP

### **OACNY Partnership**

Volunteer architects and OACNY staff worked with the BID team to create innovative resources and programming to support business owners during the pandemic.



#### Fall Festival

This year marked the 19th Annual Fall Festival. Although we didn't hold our traditional street fair, we made sure to keep the essence of the Fall Festival alive on a smaller scale while still maintaining safety measures and social distancing. Together with Montefiore's Office of Government and Community Relations the BID provided free flu shots, pumpkins, hand sanitizer, health information, voting information and masks to the community.



# Bronx Community Foundation Day

The BID received \$50,000 in grant funding from the Bronx Community Foundation to distribute to local businesses struggling to recover from pandemic losses. We were able to provide direct relief to 6 long time business owners in the district.



### Turkey Giveaway

In partnership with the Metro CCA Carpenter's Union and MPC, the BID helped to donate 150 turkeys to families in need.

## Pandemic Response

## **Grant and Loan Assistance**

e partnered with a local accounting firm, Main Street Group Holdings, to provide free loan packaging to small business owners in the BID.


Ten businesses received free one on one marketing consultations with a small business marketing professional, The DM Firm. They received a custom plan to help them with marketing, advertising, and growth.

In March of this year, we immediately organized to lead a coalition of Bronx business organizations that helped to package over 1,000 applications for City, State and Federal loans and grants. We established new relationships with pro-bono attorneys and accountants to assist our merchants with their applications and documentation.

The BID helped process applications for the Bronx Community Relief Effort which provides direct cash grant relief to hundreds of business owners across the Bronx.









## **PPE Distribution**

ith generous donations from Montefiore, NYC Small Business Services, and our local elected officials, the BID helped to distribute over 26,000 masks in the Bronx.

The BID team distributed hand sanitizer, face shields, and signage for BID businesses to ensure that customers and staff could work and shop safely.

Together with Mosholu Preservation Corporation (MPC), we helped to distribute 50 \$1,000 micro grants to help businesses in the Northwest Bronx purchase PPE and safety equipment, made possible by the Robin Hood Foundation.




















## **Partnerships**

he Jerome Gun Hill BID is grateful for our partners that helped us to create and launch innovative programming and resources to benefit small business owners in the wake of the pandemic. This year we worked with students from Fordham University's Gabelli School of Business, an urban planning Capstone Group from New York University, and volunteer architects and designers from the Open Architecture Collaborative of New York (OACNY).

### Fordham University

When internships were hard to come by this summer, Fordham students reached out to share their skills with local business owners. Eager to help, Fordham students helped businesses with accounting, social media, marketing, and website development.

#### NYU

The BID is working with a group of graduate urban planning students at NYU to research the impact of transportation changes and micromobility innovations on small business owners in the Bronx. Students will interview local business owners and collect both qualitative and quantitative data to understand how commercial corridors can best adapt to changes in transportation.

#### **OACNY**

OACNY volunteer architects and staff created creative signage for businesses, plans and guidance for outdoor dining and outdoor retail, and helped the BID team to devise innovative design strategies and programming for the public spaces that we steward.



## **BID Financials**

The BID's annual assessment revenue is \$259,000. In addition to our annual assessment we receive funding from grants and contracts. In FY20 our grant contracts totaled \$83,700. In total our FY20 budget was \$342,700.



The Jason Weinger Scholarship will cover the costs for a local teen to pursue music lessons through Mind-Builders Creative Arts Center music program.






